Abstract

The Janissary forces were one of the main constituents of the Ottoman army and, at certain periods, a strong component of the army. However, weak ottoman sultans and the Janissary forces being mixed with the ottoman society ultimately led to the decline of the Ottoman Empire. This state of feebleness led later ottoman sultans to reconsider the causes of this downfall and to get rid of the Janissary forces. In 1826, Sultan Mahmoud 2nd was finally able to drive the Janissary away.
