Abstract

The Arabic syntax is based on many rules; some of these rules depend on the verb only. These rules are divided into two types:- the first type is the rules which are related to the evidences of the syntax; and these are rules which help the syntactician rule. The second rules which concern the reasoning of the syntacticians when they try to explain the syntactic phenomena, or to find a solution for some contradictions in the standard Arabic speech and some contradictions rules and when they deal with the theory of the operator. There are rules which depend on the hearing and the reasoning and these are also divided into two types:- original or basic rules and these are the rules which are derived by the syntacticians from the common or dominant speech and which agree with

the reasonable thinking (measuring and comparing). The second type is; the subsidiary rules, and these are the rules which are derived from the common speech but which do not match the original rule; and they were given secondary position for their agreement with the reason, though opposing an aspect of the original.
